



PREFACE

FLOW

Arrival - Leadership team greets women as they arrive and helps them select the folder or folder additions needed for the evening. The arrival table has weekly prayer sheets, signs and sowings cards, the email sign-up sheet, folders, and pens. It may include a statue of our Blessed Mother or a St. Monica statue. A table has also been placed at the front of the church. On it are the crucifixes and a small basket for the signs and sowings cards. Quiet music plays in church as women find their seats.

OPENING REMARKS

FACILITATOR: Let us begin by coming before our Eucharistic Lord, present in the tabernacle, in prayer. Please stand and let us pray together our opening prayer found at the top of your prayer sheet.

Lord we come before You, to worship and adore You. We lay all our worries and anxieties at Your feet and put our trust in You. May this time we spend together in your Eucharistic Presence nourish our hearts and minds and strengthen our relationship with You. Amen.

Please be seated. Welcome to Millions of Monicas! We pray to encounter God through prayer for ourselves, and for our children, as we grow in holiness and humility.

We are mothers, grandmothers, aunts, Godmothers and Confirmation sponsors who, together, bring all our concerns in prayer before our Heavenly Father. We know by coming together, that we are not alone, and this gives us blessed reassurance and hope.

Welcome especially if you are new. We are glad you are joining us. Just like every week, we will be lifting up our children, and each other, in prayer. Some of our children are practicing Catholics, others have become disconnected from their Catholic faith. We pray for ALL OF OUR CHILDREN as we lift them up so that ALL may embrace and live more fully our beautiful Catholic faith.

To ensure the comfort of all, as well as to maintain the privacy of those participating in Millions of Monicas, please do not share any information regarding participants or names given. Because we are all spiritual mothers, throughout our prayers we will use the word mother to refer to all of us.

WEEKLY MEDITATION

Facilitator: Please be seated. We will now play today's scripture reading and reflection, where we can see the work of God in our lives through His word.

Facilitator, Musician or Leadership starts the APP playing by doing the following:

Open the Pray As You Go APP on your phone/device.

Click on PLAY.

The current day's reading will pop up.

Press the PLAY arrow to begin.



SIGNS AND SOWINGS

FACILITATOR: Next we will take some time to reflect on seeing the work of God in our lives this past week in a tangible way.

Take out the card located in your blue folder called Signs and Sowings. It is two-sided. What you write is anonymous, we do not read them.

This is a time for us to contemplate the signs we are seeing in the children we have been praying for, as well as to write down what we have done last week to sow the seeds of faith in the children of others. It might not have been the child of someone here, but we encounter the children of others throughout the week, and we have opportunities to evangelize and call others back to church as well as to encourage and strengthen those who are actively practicing their Catholic faith.

When you are finished filling it in, bring it up to the basket on the table and drop it in. Make sure to reverence our Lord in the tabernacle. This is an outward sign of surrendering our children over to God and placing them into His care.

Facilitator or music person: Turn ON quiet background music now.

FACILITATOR: Allow approximately 5 minutes total for this activity. Keep an eye on everyone to see when all are finished.

Facilitator or music person: Turn OFF music when finished.



TRUST ME CARD

FACILITATOR: Now we will read the Trust Me card, as a reminder to all of us to place our trust in God always. The card is found in your blue folder. Get that out now. Please stand, and as we read, let's imagine our Lord speaking these words to us.

FACILITATOR:

Do you believe that I am the Son of God? And do you believe that I died for all men and women and that I rose from the dead? Then why do you continue to be distracted and anxious about your loved ones? Do they not also belong to Me? Would I refuse to work in their lives just as I work in yours? I have not put you in charge of redeeming them. I have already done that. Nor do you have the power to change their hearts; only my Holy Spirit searches and knows the deepest hearts of men and women, and only He can heal their deepest wounds. Your task is to love, to forgive, to pray for them and to turn them over to Me. Come closer to Me yourself, and I will do the rest. TRUST ME!



SMALL GROUP CRUCIFIX PRAYER

FACILITATOR:

Next, we will take some time to pray SILENTLY for each child that we bring as an intention before the Lord. During this time, we will be sharing only the first and middle name of the child we are praying for. As each mother takes a turn, the rest of the women in the group will be praying SILENTLY for that mother and her intention.

We would like you to get into groups of 3 now. If able, please find some moms you don't know and gather with them. Select one person from each group to come to the front to get a crucifix.

Facilitator or music person: Turn ON quiet background music now.

We will begin by having the mother holding the crucifix tell the rest of the people in her group the first and middle name of the child she is praying for. For the rest of the members in that group, please write that name on your prayer sheet so you can pray for that mother and that child SILENTLY now AND throughout the week. (PAUSE)

(Time passes, 2-3 minutes at least)

When you are ready, please pass the crucifix.

AND NOW WE WILL TAKE 1 MINUTE TO PRAY FOR ALL THOSE CHILDREN WHO HAVE NO ONE PRAYING FOR THEM. *(Time passes, 1 minute)*

We unite our prayers with the countless mothers in Millions of Monicas around the world, who, like us, wait and pray for their children's return. We stand together in hope, bound by our love for our children and our faith in Your mercy. Hear our collective prayers, Lord. May our children encounter the transformative power of Your love and embrace the faith of their baptism with renewed joy and conviction. Amen.

Please return the crucifixes to the front.

Facilitator or music person: Turn OFF quiet background music now.



MOM PRAYER

FACILITATOR: Next we will read the MOM prayer together. It is on the reverse side of your Prayer Sheet. Where you see the long line, each of us will insert the first and middle name of the child we are praying for, spoken all at once, in unison. Please stand.

FACILITATOR:

In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit,

Lord Jesus, I come before You with a heart full of longing and hope, entrusting my beloved child, (Name: _____) into Your tender and merciful care. You know the depths of my soul, the silent tears I have wept, and the ache within me as a mother whose child has wandered from the path of faith. Yet Lord, I trust in the boundless reach of Your love. No heart is ever too distant, no journey beyond redemption.

Like St. Monica, who once wept for her son, I turn to You in unwavering trust. Strengthen me in prayer, Lord, even when the road seems long and uncertain. Let me trust in Your perfect timing, knowing that Your grace is always at work, even in the unseen.

With all my heart, I lift up my child, (Name: _____), into Your embrace. Soften their hearts Lord. Remove every barrier that keeps them from You. Dispel their doubts, heal their wounds, and free them from anything that leads them away from You, Lord. Ignite within them a longing for truth, a hunger for Your presence, and a deep desire to return to the faith of their baptism. Let the Holy Spirit stir within them, gently guiding them back to the joy, peace and grace of the Sacraments. May they hear Your voice calling them home.

Also, hold in Your protection those who remain faithful to You in a world filled with trials. Strengthen them with unwavering trust so that their lives may radiate integrity in faith, fervor in devotion and the fire of charity.

FACILITATOR: Next we will pray the rosary together. If you want to come forward now and join us in the front pews, we would love that, but if you want to stay where you are, that's fine too.

As we pray, let us hold in our hearts the intention of our children's return to our glorious Catholic faith.

FACILITATOR OR LEADER FROM THE CONGREGATION:
Leads Rosary.

In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, Amen.

I BELIEVE IN GOD, the Father almighty, Creator of Heaven and earth. And in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, Who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate; was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into Hell. The third day He rose again from the dead. He ascended into Heaven, and sits at the right hand of God, the Father almighty. He shall come again to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen

**PRAYER
TO
ST. MONICA**

FACILITATOR: Next we will pray the prayer to St. Monica. This can be found in your folder on the reverse side of the Welcome Sheet. As we pray this prayer to St. Monica, when we see the word “Name” in parentheses each of us will say the first and middle name of the child we are praying for, out loud, all at once, in unison, lifting our chorus of names spoken to the Lord. Please stand.

FACILITATOR:

In the name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Under the weight of my heartfelt burden, I turn to you, dear St. Monica and request your assistance and intercession. From your place in heaven, I beg that you will plead before the Throne of the Holy One, for the sake of my child, _____ [NAME], who has wandered from the faith, and all that we have tried to teach. I know, dear Monica, that our children belong not to us, but to God, and that God often permits this wandering as part of one’s journey toward Him. Your son, Augustine, wandered, too; eventually he found the faith, and came to believe, and in that belief became a true teacher.

Help me, therefore, to have patience and to believe that all things – even this disappointing movement from the faith – work ultimately to His own good purposes. For the sake of my child’s soul, I pray to understand and trust this. St. Monica, please teach me to persist in faithful prayer as you did for your son’s sake. Inspire me to behave in ways that will not further distance my child from Christ, but only draw _____ [NAME] gently toward His marvelous light. Please teach me what you know about this painful mystery of separation, and how it is reconciled in the re-orientation of our children toward heaven.

O Saint Monica, lover of Christ and His Church, pray for me and for my child _____ [NAME], that we may acquire heaven, joining with you, there, in offering constant and thankful praise to God. AMEN.
